Perceiving the Dignity of Others

Jesus passed through towns and villages, teaching as he went and making his way to Jerusalem. Someone asked him, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" He answered them, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." Luke 13:22–24

The context of this passage provides insight into Jesus' mission and His concern for each and every person. Note that Jesus was traveling toward the large and populous city of Jerusalem. But as He traveled, He passed through "towns and villages" and taught the people as He went. This might seem like a small detail, but it is also a significant one. A city like Jerusalem was large and often had wealthy, influential, and "important" people. The less-populated towns had borders and often some form of local government. Villages were much smaller rural areas, often made up of poorer, less educated, less influential, and simpler people. One historian, Josephus, wrote that there were about 240 villages throughout Galilee at the time Jesus lived. It's interesting to note that Jesus wanted to teach everyone. He didn't care if they were wealthy and powerful people in the large city or peasant farmers and shepherds from the countryside. His mission was to all. One thing this teaches us is that we, also, must have love and concern for everyone, regardless of their social status. Each and every person is equal in dignity. From the president of a large country, to the beggar in an alleyway, everyone deserves our respect and attention in an equal way. Our fallen human nature experiences various forms of temptation. Among them are temptations for riches, power and prestige. For that reason, we tend to admire those who have obtained worldly success because we want it for ourselves. As a result, we tend to show greater respect for those who have achieved what we covet and give less attention to those who do not have that success. This, of course, goes to the heart of the problem. When you think about the people whom you have encountered recently, what comes to mind? Perhaps your "encounter" was to read about someone's great success in the financial world. Or perhaps it was to read about someone's demise in another way. Perhaps a neighbor has done well and purchased a new car, or a friend got fired from a job. Whatever the case may be, it is important to consider the level of personal respect and love you show for each person. It must be equal. Worldly status cannot determine how we treat others. This is hard to avoid. The teaching that Jesus gave to those in the towns and villages was an exhortation to holiness. "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." And at the end of today's Gospel, Jesus says, "For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." The latter statement must have especially resonated with those who felt somewhat insignificant and unimportant in life. Those who felt like they were "last" would have received a certain hope. This tells us that God never measures us by our successes from a worldly standpoint. He measures us only on the level of our fidelity to His holy will. Reflect, today, upon how you look at all people. Do you see every person in the way that God sees them? Do you see everyone with equal dignity and worth? Or do you elevate those whom you envy and whose success you covet? Seek to eliminate all worldly ways of looking at others so that you will only look at others through the lens of their dignity and fidelity to the will of God. Lord, as You journeyed through life, You looked only at the hearts of those You encountered. You treated each person with dignity and love. Please help me to shed all temptations to see others through the eyes of the world and to show full respect to all of Your sons and daughters. Jesus, I trust in You.

PLEASE PRAY FOR PRIESTS

We thank you, God our Father, for those who have responded to your call to priestly ministry. Accept this prayer we offer on their behalf; Fill your priests with the sure knowledge of your love. Open their hearts to the power and consolation of the Holy Spirit. Lead them to new depths of union with your Son. Lord Jesus Christ, grant that these, your priests, may inspire us to strive for holiness by the power of their example, as men of prayer who ponder your word and follow your will.

O Mary, Mother of Christ and our mother, guard with your material care these chosen ones, so dear to the Heart of your Son. Intercede for our priests that, offering the Sacrifice of your Son, they may be conformed more each day to the image of your Son, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Baptismal Information *YOU MUST BE A REGISTERED & PRACTICING PARISHIONER*

Parents must fill out a Baptismal Registration Form and Godparents must be fill out a Baptismal Godparent Form. They can be found on the church website (www.stspeterandpaulscott.org) under sacraments.

You must bring the forms to the Church Office.

You will then have to make an appointment with Fr. Mark.

After approval by Fr. Mark, parents and godparents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class.

Criteria for Godparents: Must be at least 16 years old, confirmed, and a practicing Catholic. They must be able to receive communion & in good standing.

Non-Catholic godparents are highly discouraged. They will NOT appear on the baptismal certificate!

The SPP Traditional Church Choir is open to anyone high school age and up. This choir sings every Sunday at the 10am mass, as well as special holiday masses and events. There are no auditions, except to assign vocal placement and it is not required that members read music to be a part of this group. We rehearse every Wednesday from 6:15-7:15. Every member of the Traditional Church Choir that is 18 or over must be Safe Environment Trained.

Our worship experience in mass is enhanced by our full and active participation which includes singing, so we encourage everyone to fully participate through singing. "He who sings," said St. Augustine, "prays twice". The holy Bishop of Hippo stated that singing adds to our praise and worship of God; that our voices are gifts with which we can make music to the Lord and express the joy of our hearts. Prayer through song reminds us of the choirs of heaven, with whom we are called to praise God eternally.





The Truth About the Eucharist

What God's Word Says About the Eucharist

Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day. John 6:53-54 This passage cannot be understood in a figurative way. In the biblical world, when the words "to eat the flesh and drink the blood" were used metaphorically, they meant to destroy someone, either by slander or by doing physical harm. (See Isaiah 49:26; Psalm 27:2.) This is precisely why the Jews murmured at Jesus' words and why his disciples were shocked. They knew the phrase could only be taken literally. Jesus did not correct any misunderstanding on the part of the crowd or his disciples. He simply reminded them that it is necessary to have God's Spirit to be able to accept such a teaching. (See John 6:63.) Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be answerable for the body and blood of the Lord.... For all who eat and drink without discerning the body, eat and drink judgment against themselves. 1 Corinthians 11:27,29 Why do these verses cause difficulties for those who insist on a figurative interpretation? The unworthy reception of earthly bread and earthly wine could never cause a Christian to be damned. In addition a figurative interpretation presents a problem for those who insist that the bread and wine themselves are not changed but rather are given a new meaning by the participants who receive them as heavenly food. One cannot give a new spiritual meaning to the bread and wine while at the same time eating and drinking in an unworthy manner. The food Paul refers to is heavenly bread because in it we receive Jesus, the One who came from heaven. The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a sharing in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread. Consider the people of Israel; are not those who eat the sacrifices partners in the altar? 1 Corinthians 10:16-18 Paul reminds the Corinthian community that their participation in the sacrificial banquet binds them together in the one bread, Jesus. Paul mentions the pagan and Jewish sacrifices in the same breath as the Christian meal: "I imply that what pagans sacrifice, they sacrifice to demons and not to God" (1 Corinthians 10:20). Those who participate in the body and blood of the Lord are bound to the Lord and to one another, not to demons. We conclude, therefore, that what is offered is not a "reminder." Rather, the actual body and blood of Christ is offered in a sacrificial banquet that joins all believers together. Jesus, our paschal lamb, has been sacrificed; he, alone, is a worthy offering to God the Father. (See 1 Corinthians 5:7-8.)






