Transformed by God's Word

Yeast is small—invisible once it is worked into the dough. And yet, its influence is pervasive and powerful. This simple image—yeast worked into three measures of flour, causing it to slowly rise—reveals that the Kingdom of Heaven is built quietly, almost imperceptibly, from within. Like leaven silently transforming dough from the inside, so too does God's grace operate—hidden yet active—in the heart, in the Church, and in the world. Patiently watching dough rise can be a small wonder, especially for children. In this brief parable, the yeast symbolizes the Word of God, and the wheat flour, the human soul. When God's Word is welcomed by faith, it possesses the power to transform the entire soul. Just as yeast elevates and expands flour into bread, so God's Word elevates human nature and conforms it to Himself. How awe-inspiring it is to behold the gradual transformation of a soul animated by divine grace! Saint Augustine offers several interpretations of the "three measures" of wheat flour. He suggests they can represent the threefold interior life of the human person: heart, soul, and mind (cf. Matthew 22:37); or the three degrees of fruitfulness described in the parable of the sower—"a hundredfold, sixtyfold, and thirtyfold" (cf. Matthew 13:23); or even the three righteous men mentioned in Ezekiel—Noah, Daniel, and Job (cf. Ezekiel 14:14), each representing a distinct path of fidelity under trial. Each of these interpretations reveals how God's transforming Word is at work not only in the individual soul, but within the Church and throughout all humanity. Though "three measures" might not sound like much, it was in fact a substantial amount. According to ancient Jewish and Roman measurements, three measures (or satons) could equal nearly fifty pounds of flour—enough to feed more than a hundred people. The parable, therefore, is about abundance—the superabundant fruitfulness of God's Word when it is thoroughly received—penetrating deeply into the individual soul, the Church, and society. Like leaven in dough, this transformation takes time. Though not immediate, it is steady, enduring, and complete. Consider your own life: Has the Word of God been thoroughly mixed into your whole being—into your heart, your soul, and your mind? Has it leavened your interior life so completely that even your smallest actions are touched by grace? Has divine love taken hold of you—not in part, but in whole? Furthermore, do you see your interconnectedness with the Church and rejoice in the many ways God is at work within Her and Her members? Do you gaze upon the world and, with wonder and awe, perceive God's hidden activity? It is easy to focus on the worldly chaos and to be drawn into the sensationalism of evil. But it takes a truly perceptive soul—like a child watching dough rise—to behold the quiet, steady work of God, who is ever bringing His Kingdom to life—quietly, steadily, and far and wide. Reflect today on the quiet ways God is at work within you, within the Church, and throughout the world. Though you might not always perceive the movement of grace, trust that it is active—like yeast in dough—gently transforming, sanctifying, and preparing hearts for the glory to come. Resist the temptation to measure your spiritual growth by visible signs or immediate results. Instead, remain faithful to prayer, attentive to the Word, and docile to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. God's Kingdom unfolds in time, and its rising is certain. Even when the world seems overwhelmed by sin or division, remember that the leaven is at work. The final loaf is being prepared for the eternal banquet—and you are being made ready, one hidden grace at a time, until you are fully prepared to share in the joy of the eternal feast.

Most Holy Word of God, speak to me, enter my heart, and transform me by Your grace. Send forth Your Word into Your Church on earth. Make Her holy, that She may reflect the beauty and strength of the Body of Christ. Use me and all the members of Your Body to witness to the world—especially to those who do not yet know You—so that they may be drawn into the wonder and awe of Your transforming power and come to partake in the superabundant Banquet to which we are all called. Jesus, I trust in You.

PLEASE PRAY FOR PRIESTS

We thank you, God our Father, for those who have responded to your call to priestly ministry. Accept this prayer we offer on their behalf; Fill your priests with the sure knowledge of your love. Open their hearts to the power and consolation of the Holy Spirit. Lead them to new depths of union with your Son. Increase in them profound faith in the Sacraments they celebrate as they nourish, strengthen and heal us.

Lord Jesus Christ, grant that these, your priests, may inspire us to strive for holiness by the power of their example, as men of prayer who ponder your word and follow your will.

O Mary, Mother of Christ and our mother, guard with your maternal care these chosen ones, so dear to the Heart of your Son. Intercede for our priests that, offering the Sacrifice of your Son, they may be conformed more each day to the image of your Son, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Amen.

YOU MUST BE A REGISTERED & PRACTICING PARISHIONER

Parents must fill out a Baptismal Registration Form and Godparents must fill out a Baptismal Godparent Form.

They can be found on the church website (www.stspeterandpaulscott.org) under sacraments.

You must bring the forms to the Church Office.

You will then have to make an appointment with Fr. Mark. After approval by Fr. Mark, parents and godparents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class.

Criteria for Godparents: Must be at least 16 years old, confirmed, and a practicing Catholic. They must be able to receive communion & in good standing. Non-Catholic godparents are highly discouraged. They will **NOT** appear on the baptismal certificate!

Thanking God for 250 Years! No better way to thank God and pray for America than accompanying Jesus in the Eucharist for a day of prayer and adoration on Bayou Teche during Fête-Dieu du Teche 2026! Individuals, families and parishes are encouraged to register a boat or gather at one or more of the stops along the procession route. The day begins at 8 AM with Sunday Mass in French by Bishop Douglas Deshotel at St. Leo the Great Catholic Church in Leonville. Following the Mass there will be a procession with the Blessed Sacrament and a statue of Mary and St. Joseph to the nearby boat landing. At 9:30 AM boats will depart in procession down Bayou Teche toward St. Martinville, retracing the voyage made by the Acadians 260 years ago. Bayou residents are encouraged to gather and greet the Blessed Sacrament as it passes near their home. The boat procession will stop at churches in the towns along the Teche for Rosary and Benediction (arriving at Arnaudville behind St. Francis Regis at 10:20 AM; arriving behind St. Joseph Church in Cecilia at 11:45 AM; arriving at the Pavilion behind St. Bernard Church in Breaux Bridge at 1:35 PM; arriving at the park behind St. Joseph Church in Parks at 3:15 PM; and arriving at Notre Dame Church in St Martinville at about 4:45 PM). Upon arriving in St. Martinville, a foot procession will commence to Notre Dame de Perpetual Secours for Benediction,

then to St. Martin de Tours for Benediction, and finally down Main Street to Mater Dolorosa Chapel for Solemn Vespers and Final Benediction at 6:00 PM. Confessions will be heard in mobile units at each of the stops along the way. Participants of Fête-Dieu du Teche can gain a Plenary Indulgence by participating. The indulgence is valid on **August 15** for those who attend the 8 am French Mass in Leonville, those who make the procession by boat, and those who participate in the devotions at one of the many stops along the Teche. Those who are impeded for a serious reason from physically attending the procession may also gain the indulgence by spiritually uniting their prayers and trials. The Holy Father asks participants to pray for fidelity to the Christian vocation, for the good of the family, and for priestly and religious vocations. 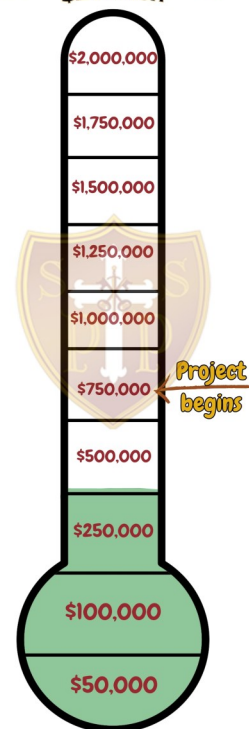

From the Desk of the Pastor

Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar

What Is Eucharistic Adoration?

Eucharistic Adoration is the time for prayer in which Roman Catholics adore Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Most Blessed Sacrament. This type of Divine Worship logically flows from the Roman Catholic Dogma that Jesus Christ is Truly and Sacramentally Present-Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity-in the Most Holy Eucharist, under the appearance of bread in the Consecrated Host. In adoration, Roman Catholics seek to revere and encounter deeply Our Lord in the Most Holy Eucharist. It is a wonderful time for prayer, thanksgiving, and worship. Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament, also known as Adoration of the Most Holy Eucharist, is an act of worship given to Almighty God alone. In adoration, Roman Catholics worship and glorify Jesus Christ Who is Truly Present in the Most Holy Eucharist. Worship differs markedly from the veneration and honor given to the Saints, especially to Our Most Blessed Mother.

What is the Origin of Eucharistic Adoration?

Eucharist Adoration began at the Last Supper, when Jesus Christ instituted the Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and the Apostles revered and received Him in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Holy Mother Church affirmed the Real Presence, including the reserving the Most Holy Eucharist for the sick and dying. Our Lord helps Holy Mother Church deepen Her understanding of Sacred Truth through confronting heresy, in this case when Pope Gregory VII required Berengarius of Tours to affirm the Real Presence in 1079. As a result, reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament grew over subsequent centuries. Saint Francis of Assisi had a great devotion to Our Eucharistic Lord, and, in 1226, weeks before Saint Francis died, King Louis VII of France asked the Bishop of Avignon to expose the Most Holy Eucharist in the Chapel of the Holy Cross, resulting in the first extended Adoration of the Most Holy Eucharist. Twenty years later, in 1246, Corpus Christi was first celebrated in the Diocese of Liège, and later, in 1264, a year after the Eucharistic Miracle of Bolsena in central Italy, Pope Urban IV instituted Corpus Christi as a Universal Solemnity in the Holy Roman Catholic Church. These events fueled Eucharistic Adoration through the rise of public processions, and, in turn, helped evangelize Europe.

Why should Roman Catholics go to Eucharistic Adoration?

Because Adoration provides a direct, intimate encounter with Our Eucharistic Lord Jesus Christ. Adoration provides opportunity for silence, reflection and--most important--Divine Intimacy and His Peace that this world cannot provide.

Is Eucharistic Adoration a Sacrament?

Although Jesus Christ is Truly Present during Adoration-Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the Most Blessed Sacrament, no Sacrament is administered. Rather, Adoration is a type of worship which liturgically extends from the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The length of Eucharistic Adoration is typically one hour.

The Healing Power of Eucharistic Adoration

The purpose of Eucharistic Adoration is to Adore Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist-to give Him worship. Every moment spent before the Most Blessed Sacrament is a moment well spent, because it draws us closer to Most Sacred Heart of Jesus Christ. As we kneel before the Most Holy Eucharist, we kneel before the Creator of the universe. In Adoration, we gaze upon the Living Christ, for He is Truly Present in the Most Holy Eucharist, longing to draw our hearts closer to His Most Sacred Heart.

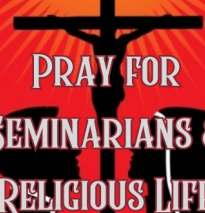
