## The Essence of the Most Holy Trinity

*"All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Matthew 28:19–20 (Year B Gospel)* Of all the great feasts we celebrate within the Church throughout the year, today's Solemnity presents us with a Mystery that is so deep and transcendent that our eternity will be spent in perpetual contemplation. The Trinity, the life of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, will never get old, never be fully understood, and will be the cause of our everlasting adoration and joy. Though the Church has used philosophical concepts to explain the Trinity, no human concept or description will ever fully explain Who God is. Though we can point to some general truths about God, we will never be able to fully depict the inner essence, depth, beauty and omnipotence of the Trinity.

As we consider that fact, it's important to understand that the Trinity is not first a theological mystery we try to define. Rather, the Trinity is first a communion of Persons we are invited to know. We do not primarily come to know God through intellectual deduction. We come to know God through prayerful union with Him. Though theology is exceptionally useful and important, the essence of God is beyond any and every philosophical concept we can define. The Father, Son and Holy Spirit are Persons. And as Persons, they want to be known. And they want to be known primarily through a life of deep and intimate prayer. Praying to One Person, of course, is praying to all, since they are One God. But we are, nonetheless, called to a relationship of love with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. And though our feeble minds may not be able to fully comprehend the essence of God, He will draw us deeper and deeper into a knowledge of Him if we let Him.

Prayer often begins by saying prayers, by meditating upon Scripture, and by listening. But true prayer is something much deeper. True prayer is contemplative prayer that ultimately leads to divine union. Only God can initiate this form of prayer in our lives, and only God, through this deep form of prayer, can communicate Himself to us as He is. Some of the greatest mystics of our Church, such as Saint John of the Cross and Saint Teresa of Ávila, explain in their mystical theology that the deepest knowledge of God does not come through concepts or images. In fact, if we wish to obtain a knowledge of God in His essence, we must allow Him to purge every concept of Who He is so that the pure light of His essence can be poured forth upon our minds. This knowledge, they say, is beyond knowing "about" God. It's the beginning of a knowledge "of" God.

Reflect, today, upon the Most Holy Trinity. As you do, say a prayer to God asking for a deeper and more intimate knowledge of Him. Ask Him to communicate to you His divine love and to open your mind and heart to a deeper understanding of Who He is. Try to humble yourself before the great Mystery of the inner life of God. Humility before the Mystery of God means that we know how little we know about Him and how little we know of Him. But that humble truth will help you move closer to the deeper relationship of love to which you are called.



As we are about to enter the summer season, we are reminded of the importance of continuing our support for our parish community. Your generosity sustains the vital ministries and services that enrich our spiritual journey and support those in need.

## Baptismal Information \*YOU MUST BE A REGISTERED & PRACTICING PARISHIONER\*

Parents must fill out a Baptismal Registration Form and Godparents must be fill out a Baptismal Godparent Form. They can be found on the church website (**www.stspeterandpaulscott.org**) under sacraments. **You must bring the forms to the Church Office.** 

You will then have to make an appointment with Fr. Mark. After approval by Fr. Mark, parents and godparents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class.

Criteria for Godparents: Must be at least 16 years old, confirmed, and a practicing Catholic. They must be able to receive communion & in good standing.

Non-Catholic godparents are highly discouraged. They will **NOT** appear on the baptismal certificate!



The first reading and responsorial psalm extol the wonders of God's creation, from the heavens to the earth, from the human race to the beasts of the field to the fishes of the sea. Saint Paul tells the Romans that through the Holy Spirit, God's love has been poured into our hearts. The Holy Spirit, Jesus tells his disciples in the Gospel, glorifies the Son as the Son alorifies the Father. Through the love of God and the wonders of creation, may the Holy Spirit guide us to the Son and the Father.

#### The Truth About the Eucharist Rev. John Dowling Not By Bread Alone

Both those who believe the Eucharist is merely an earthly sign that helps us remember a divine reality and those who believe it is magic fail to understand the words of Jesus:

"One does not live by bread alone, / but by every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4). As it is no longer possible to separate Word from flesh in Jesus, we cannot separate the Word of God from the flesh of Christ in the Eucharist.

The flesh and blood of Jesus Christ give eternal life: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever" (John 6:51). Through the power of God's Word and Spirit, the bread from earth becomes living bread from heaven.

The words spoken at the consecration by the priest—who acts in the role and person of Christ—transform the bread and wine into the actual body and blood of Jesus Christ.

Although the priest pronounces these words, their power comes from God. (See Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 1375; future references to the Catechism are indicated by CCC, followed by the paragraph number.) Through the presence of the Holy Spirit in the eucharistic body of Christ, Jesus comes to us as living bread. By the power of God's Word, we receive eternal life in holy Communion because of the living faith made possible by the Spirit's action.

When Jesus identifies the bread that he will give to the world as his own flesh, his listeners respond, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" (John 6:52). Jesus did not clarify this revelation by reducing it to a matter of metaphor, but expanded this teaching to include the drinking of his blood. Jesus was aware that many of his disciples found this saying difficult to accept. Jesus knew that flesh and blood could not inherit the kingdom of God and that no one could come to him unless it is granted him by his Father. (See

1 Corinthians 15:50; John 6:65.) So Jesus reminded his disciples of the power of the Spirit who was active in his words and of the necessity of belief. (See John 6:63; 6:69.) The Word and Spirit of Jesus enable us to believe that Jesus' flesh and blood are true food and true drink. (See John 6:55.)

There is no greater way to celebrate the Word made flesh in Bethlehem than through the celebration and reception of the Word made flesh in holy Communion. In the eucharistic celebration, the very eating and drinking become a proclamation of the Good News.

The Christian knows that the Word of God in Scripture is not a simple recalling of significant events in salvation history, but is "living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword. able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12). Similarly, this memorial meal is "not merely the recollection of past events but the proclamation of the mighty works wrought by God for men" (CCC 1363).

## **Prayer for Hurricane Season**

O God, Master of this passing world, hear the humble voices of your children. The Sea of Galilee obeyed Your order and returned to its former quietude. You are still the Master of land and sea. We live in the shadow of a danger over which we have no control; the Gulf, like a provoked and angry giant, can awake from its seeming lethargy, overstep its conventional boundaries, invade our land, and spread chaos and disaster.

During this hurricane season we turn to You, O loving Father. Spare us from past tragedies whose memories are still so vivid and whose wounds seem to refuse to heal with passing of time. O Virgin, Star of the Sea, Our beloved Mother, we ask you to plead with your Son on our behalf, so that spared from the calamities common to this area and animated with a true spirit of gratitude, we will walk in the footsteps of your Divine Son to reach the heavenly Jerusalem, where a stormless eternity awaits us.

Amen.

This weekend, we joyfully celebrate and honor all the fathers, grandfathers, and father figures within our parish community. Your love, sacrifice, and steadfast guidance are a living testament to the Heavenly Father's boundless care for each of us. As we give thanks for your invaluable role in our lives, let us also turn to our Lord in prayer. May God bestow upon you His divine wisdom, strength, and peace, empowering you to continue leading your families in faith and love. May St. Joseph, the earthly father of Jesus and our model of fatherhood, intercede for you and inspire you always. Happy Father's Day, and may God's grace be with you abundantly!
