Question of the Week:

How do I envision the Holy Spirit renewing the face of the earth? How can I, with the Holy Spirit working through me, be a part of that renewal?

The fifty-day season of Easter concludes with the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit. On Pentecost, we celebrate God's constant presence in all who believe, for we trust that the Holy Spirit remains with us always, guiding our lives, animating our souls, and flowing through us to bear fruit in the world. Indeed, today and every Sunday the Holy Spirit draws us here to together give thanks and praise to God for the wondrous gifts we have been given.

Come to Us Holy Spirit!

And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Acts 2:2–4

Happy birthday! Today, as we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we also celebrate the birth of the Church. Thus, today is a celebration of your membership in the life of the Church. As a human institution, the Church has always suffered on account of the sins of Her members. This sad truth is something that we are increasingly aware of today. But the Church itself is the Spotless Bride of Christ. It is the Body of Christ on earth, in Heaven and in Purgatory. Those of us on earth are members of the Church Militant. Those in Heaven are members of the Church Triumphant. And those in Purgatory are members of the Church Suffering. But all of us are united under Christ our Head as members of His holy Body, the Church. We profess our faith in the Church every Sunday. We profess that we believe in "one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church." What exactly does this mean? First, it means that by the power and working of the Holy Spirit, those who profess faith in Christ are united as "one." This oneness is a spiritual union that will endure for eternity. It is unbreakable and restores us to the life we were created to live. That is, a life of union with God and others, a communion of humanity with God. As one family, the Church is also "holy." Holiness is another way of saying that we are made whole by the blood of Christ, sharing in His redemption. By His mercy, our sins are forgiven and we become children of the Father in Heaven, sharing the eternal life of the Son. The word "catholic" refers to the truth that the offer of salvation is given to all. It is a universal calling given to all people who will accept this gift. God did not come to save only a few but all, and many will accept this gift of salvation. We are "apostolic," in that God chose to establish His Church through the mediation of His Apostles. They were uniquely called to become instruments by which the saving Truth is proclaimed and the grace won by the Cross is distributed. The work of the Apostles continues today through their successors, the bishops, and those who are co-workers with the bishops, the priests. Sinful though they may be, God uses them, nonetheless, to bestow His grace and truth upon the world. As a member of the one Body of Christ, you are also invited by God to enlarge His family through the sharing of the Gospel and by your life of deep prayer. You are called and sent, and this takes place by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit that we especially celebrate today. Reflect, today, upon the incredible privilege it is to be invited to be a member of the Family of God, the Church. And reflect, also, upon the important duty you have to extend that invitation to others. Pray to the Holy Spirit, asking for an increase in His seven-fold gifts in your life so that You can help share the saving message of the Gospel to those whom God wants to reach through you.

PLEASE PRAY FOR PRIESTS

We thank you, God our Father, for those who have responded to your call to priestly ministry. Accept this prayer we offer on their behalf; Fill your priests with the sure knowledge of your love. Open their hearts to the power and consolation of the Holy Spirit. Lead them to new depths of union with your Son. Increase in them profound faith in the Sacraments they celebrate as they nourish, strengthen and heal us.

Lord Jesus Christ, grant that these, your priests, may inspire us to strive for holiness by the power of their example, as men of prayer who ponder your word and follow your will.

O Mary, Mother of Christ and our mother, guard with your material care these chosen ones, so dear to the Heart of your Son. Intercede for our priests that, offering the Sacrifice of your Son, they may be conformed more each day to the image of your Son, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Amen.

Amending the Soil

Readings: Acts 2:1-11; 1 Cor 12:3b-1, 12-13 or Rom 8:8-17; John 20:19-23 or 14:15-16, 23b-26

Scripture: Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth. (Ps 104:30)

Reflection: Our faces often reveal what is going on inside of us physically, mentally, and spiritually. What does the face of the earth reveal when beauty and serenity live side by side with pollution and battlegrounds? Or when creativity and care for the common good are being outpaced by sterile conformity and selfish hoarding? Oh, our earth could use some restoration for sure! While we cannot return to the idyllic Eden of the creation accounts, we can invite God's Spirit to help us be part of the renewal that's so desperately needed. The same Spirit or breath of God that hovered over the earth's chaos in the first account of creation hovers over us still. We see evidence in its fruit, which Paul describes to the Galatians as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal 5:22-23). If we could pull back the surface of what is happening on our planet, would we find those virtues, or would we find rivalry, jealousy, envy, immorality, self-centeredness? We know that what lies beneath the surface feeds what grows on top of it. The Spirit will help us amend the soil beneath the chaos if we're also willing to do some of the work of tilling and fertilizing and planting. What might that look like? Attending to the needs of the sick, respectfully engaging with people who are different from us, refusing to give in to revenge, learning to limit our overconsumption of goods, standing with those who are treated unjustly, giving and receiving forgiveness—these are just some of the things that make of our lives the healthy soil that will produce good fruit.

Meditation: We are often overwhelmed by the enormity of the world's ills and the volume of hateful noise that surrounds us. Instead, on this day when we celebrate the Spirit's presence among us, ask the Spirit to overwhelm you with compassion, strength of purpose, resilience, and hope. Make time for the stillness of prayer which will orient you to God's purposes.

Prayer: Spirit of the Living God, refresh us. Multiply our efforts to be part of restoring the beauty of the earth by caring for one another and embracing your vision for our existence.

The Truth About the Eucharist

Not By Bread Alone

Both those who believe the Eucharist is merely an earthly sign that helps us remember a divine reality and those who believe it is magic fail to understand the words of Jesus:

"One does not live by bread alone, / but by every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4). As it is no longer possible to separate Word from flesh in Jesus, we cannot separate the Word of God from the flesh of Christ in the Eucharist.

The flesh and blood of Jesus Christ give eternal life: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever" (John 6:51). Through the power of God's Word and Spirit, the bread from earth becomes living bread from heaven.

The words spoken at the consecration by the priest—who acts in the role and person of Christ—transform the bread and wine into the actual body and blood of Jesus Christ.

Although the priest pronounces these words, their power comes from God. (See Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 1375; future references to the Catechism are indicated by CCC, followed by the paragraph number.) Through the presence of the Holy Spirit in the eucharistic body of Christ, Jesus comes to us as living bread. By the power of God's Word, we receive eternal life in holy Communion because of the living faith made possible by the Spirit's action.

When Jesus identifies the bread that he will give to the world as his own flesh, his listeners respond, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" (John 6:52). Jesus did not clarify this revelation by reducing it to a matter of metaphor, but expanded this teaching to include the drinking of his blood. Jesus was aware that many of his disciples found this saying difficult to accept. Jesus knew that flesh and blood could not inherit the kingdom of God and that no one could come to him unless it is granted him by his Father. (See

1 Corinthians 15:50; John 6:65.) So Jesus reminded his disciples of the power of the Spirit who was active in his words and of the necessity of belief. (See John 6:63; 6:69.) The Word and Spirit of Jesus enable us to believe that Jesus' flesh and blood are true food and true drink. (See John 6:55.)

There is no greater way to celebrate the Word made flesh in Bethlehem than through the celebration and reception of the Word made flesh in holy Communion. In the eucharistic celebration, the very eating and drinking become a proclamation of the Good News.

The Christian knows that the Word of God in Scripture is not a simple recalling of significant events in salvation history, but is "living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword. able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12). Similarly, this memorial meal is "not merely the recollection of past events but the proclamation of the mighty works wrought by God for men" (CCC 1363).

Prayer for Hurricane Season

O God, Master of this passing world, hear the humble voices of your children. The Sea of Galilee obeyed Your order and returned to its former quietude. You are still the Master of land and sea. We live in the shadow of a danger over which we have no control; the Gulf, like a provoked and angry giant, can awake from its seeming lethargy, overstep its conventional boundaries, invade our land, and spread chaos and disaster.

During this hurricane season we turn to You, O loving Father. Spare us from past tragedies whose memories are still so vivid and whose wounds seem to refuse to heal with passing of time. O Virgin, Star of the Sea, Our beloved Mother, we ask you to plead with your Son on our behalf, so that spared from the calamities common to this area and animated with a true spirit of gratitude, we will walk in the footsteps of your Divine Son to reach the heavenly Jerusalem, where a stormless eternity awaits us.

Amen.


