The Way to the Father

In addition to His parables and moral teachings, Jesus revealed to His disciples deep mysteries in a direct way that they did not immediately comprehend, especially when He spoke to the Twelve in intimate settings, such as the Last Supper, the context for today's Gospel. In this discourse, Jesus explains, in veiled form, that He will soon ascend into Heaven where He will prepare a place for His followers. He explains that because they know Him, they know the way to where He is going—the way to the Father—because He Himself is that Way. As Jesus spoke these mysterious truths, we can imagine the Twelve listening attentively, yet with confusion.

Everything Jesus taught was true. His words, recorded in the Gospels, reveal to us the deepest divine mysteries. Within the Scriptures, we find all we need to know to attain perfect holiness and the eternal life of Heaven. Yet we cannot quickly digest Jesus' words as we might an intriguing novel or history book. There are many layers of depth to what He says, and we can only understand those layers through prayer.

As the conversation continued, "Philip said to him, 'Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us.' Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'?' " (John 14:8–9).

Jesus' response likely surprised Philip and the other disciples because they did not understand what He was saying. Their intention was good—they wanted to understand—but Jesus' words were more than they could comprehend at that moment. Despite this, Jesus gently rebuked Philip as a way of drawing him deeper into the mystery He was revealing.

God often treats us the same way. There are many things that we do not understand. Why do innocent people suffer? Why doesn't God heal my loved one in answer to my prayers? Why do my children no longer practice the faith? What am I supposed to do with my life?

Just as Philip struggled to understand Jesus' words, we, too, face moments of confusion when God's ways seem beyond our grasp. God's answer to life's most challenging questions is rarely straightforward or immediate. Why? Because such an approach can never fully satisfy the depth of our hearts. Instead, God reveals a kernel of truth to us and then invites us to ponder it, revealing the divine mystery we seek to understand little by little, to the degree we are open. The answers we seek come only as we conform our wills to God's, patiently opening ourselves to His Wisdom. Divine mysteries can only be understood through prayer and deep attentiveness to the truths in God's mind. Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Only by uniting ourselves to Him in prayer will we discover the path we must walk, the truth we need to hear, and the life we are called to live.

Reflect today on anything you struggle to understand. See yourself as one of the Twelve, listening to Jesus speak, but failing to comprehend. Do not be discouraged; instead, allow the fullness of Jesus' divine Truth to sink in gradually. Spend time in prayer, read the Gospels, be open, and listen from the depths of your heart. Seek out His gentle voice and know that He is your Way, Truth, and Life. Let Him lead you and reveal to you the mysteries of His divine Wisdom so that you, too, know the way to the Father in Heaven.

Most glorious Lord, everything You have revealed to us is pure truth, yet my mind is often incapable of fully comprehending Your Wisdom. Draw me into the many mysteries You wish to reveal, and teach me to pray so that I will more fully comprehend the way to You and to Your Father in Heaven. Jesus, I trust in You.

PLEASE PRAY FOR PRIESTS

We thank you, God our Father, for those who have responded to your call to priestly ministry. Accept this prayer we offer on their behalf; Fill your priests with the sure knowledge of your love. Open their hearts to the power and consolation of the Holy Spirit. Lead them to new depths of union with your Son. Increase in them profound faith in the Sacraments they celebrate as they nourish, strengthen and heal us.

Lord Jesus Christ, grant that these, your priests, may inspire us to strive for holiness by the power of their example, as men of prayer who ponder your word and follow your will.

O Mary, Mother of Christ and our mother, guard with your maternal care these chosen ones, so dear to the Heart of your Son. Intercede for our priests that, offering the Sacrifice of your Son, they may be conformed more each day to the image of your Son, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Amen.

What can I do this week to know Jesus better, to serve those who are overlooked, and to prepare my spiritual home?

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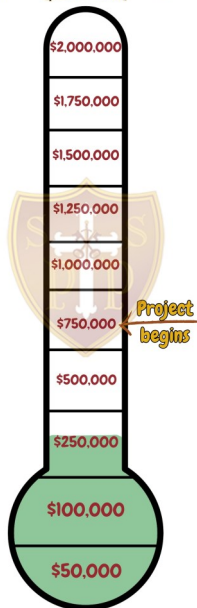

Baptismal Information

YOU MUST BE A REGISTERED & PRACTICING PARISHIONER

Parents must fill out a Baptismal Registration Form and Godparents must fill out a Baptismal Godparent Form.

They can be found on the church website (www.stspeterandpaulscott.org) under sacraments.

You must bring the forms to the Church Office.

You will then have to make an appointment with Fr. Mark.

After approval by Fr. Mark, parents and godparents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class.

Criteria for Godparents: Must be at least 16 years old, confirmed, and a practicing Catholic. They must be able to receive communion & in good standing.

Non-Catholic godparents are highly discouraged. They will **NOT** appear on the baptismal certificate!

May 3rd: Fifth Sunday of Easter *God Has a New Address*

Readings: Acts 6:1-7; 1 Pet 2:4-9; John 14:1-12

Scripture: Like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. (1 Pet 2:5)

Reflection: I grew up in a small coal mining town in central Pennsylvania. While my friends lived in company row homes—simple conjoined structures built to house miners' families a century ago—our family inhabited a multigenerational dwelling with a beer garden and dance hall down-stairs. Even after my grandparents closed their business and our relatives took up every square inch of the rooms, our home with its wraparound porch was impressive, the largest dwelling on the block.

By contrast, the house next door was a tiny two-story apparently composed of two rooms: one downstairs and another stacked on top. Their iron-fenced yard was the size of a postage stamp with a magnificent rose bush blooming prodigiously within.

Last year, sorry to say, that tiny house next door burned down. Yet I can still picture the building, timber by timber.

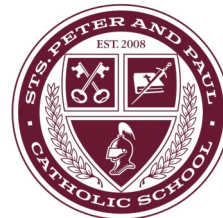
Such a fixture of my early years could never be erased and, in my mind's eye, that neighbor's house is still there. I can appreciate, then, why the early church employed the memory of the most sacred building of their religious world to describe the living church community. The temple was gone, destroyed by the Romans, its stones thrown down and most carted away.

The priesthood was decommissioned without its central purpose, performing rituals within that holy place. Animals, grain, wine, and oil were no longer brought to Jerusalem for sacrifice. Yet the writer recreates the temple by spiritualizing its structure, priesthood, and sacrifice. The tangible aspect of this re-envisioned temple is the community itself: the living stones of the faithful.

Today, Jerusalem remains holy ground to Jews, Christians, and Muslims around the world. Yet our purpose in making pilgrimage there is to be mindful that we are God's dwelling place now. Sacred memory resides in us. To encounter the Holy, we need only go within.

Meditation: All buildings are "haunted," in a way, with past associations and purposes. Which places on this earth have special resonance for you, a powerful hold on your heart or imagination? How do you touch these stones, though they may be far from where you are now?

Prayer: Help me cling to holy memories and powerful symbols, O God of sacrament and story. Enable me to find my way to you no matter where the years take me.
